Co-developed and co-taught upper-division interdisciplinary course with a field component. The Colorado River was venue for integrated biological, policy/legal, sociological and economic inquiry. Primary student outcomes included: enrichment of perspective on environmental issues (by, e.g., articulating distinctive role of Native American legal and cultural interests in Colorado River water); capacity for effective interdisciplinary analysis (e.g. interrelation of aquatic salinity readings with principles of western water rights law); capacity for independent inquiry (e.g. developing and delivering interview questions for river stakeholders.

#### PTH101 and 201: Money and the Meaning of Life

fall 2002 - spring 2006

This two-course sequence was an inagural General Education "pathway" at Colby-Sawyer College. History, philosophy, religious studies, and economics were blended. Service, creative work and field trips complemented class time. Primary student outcomes included: critical thinking (concerning e.g. money and presumptions about it); integrating modes of inquiry (from e.g. economic and spiritual frameworks); autonomy as co-authors in learning (e.g., co-writing exams).
