Music Program at Warren Wilson College

The Warren Wilson music program is for students with career ambitions in music as well as those who wish to incorporate music into their broader liberal arts experience. It offers a major (BA) and minor, stressing regional and cultural contexts through a methodological hybrid of music theory and performance, Appalachian studies, cultural studies, musicology, and ethnomusicology. A cornerstone of the program is a unique concentration in Traditional Music that emphasizes the multi-cultural roots, influences, and varieties of vernacular music within southern Appalachia. Students with interests outside of Traditional Music can choose a concentration in General Music that maintains the framework of the degree with an alternative set of core criteria and coursework.

Program Goals

- 1. To develop musicianship and performance skills.
- 2. To foster knowledge and understanding of music in its cultural and historical contexts.
- 3. To promote a critical and analytical understanding of music.

Major in Music

The Nuts & Bolts: Students must earn a minimum of 46 credit hours to fulfill the major, passing all required courses with a grade of B- or better. Also, students must maintain an overall GPA of 2.0.

Majors in music must declare a concentration in either Traditional Music or General Music.
