Our Work Program Office (WPO) requires a 30 minute session for each student. Use this link to sign up for your session ahead of time, which will allow you to get through the process quickly. What to expect on your first day.

Unpack the car, find your room, meet new friends and families — move-in day is exciting! Let's talk about specifics of what you'll be doing on this special day.

Families who need to see Financial Aid and Accounting will be directed to Kittredge Theatre. If you have completed all tasks for these offices, you will be directed to a drop-off location near your residence hall. Think of it as a drive up service. You will receive your key while WWC student leaders and athletes unload your gear — your parents don't even need to leave the air-conditioned car! You will follow the move-in crew to your new room to unlock the door and unload. Your family in the car will then be directed to a parking space. Golf carts will be available to help families get back to the residence hall. We want to make this process easy.

The other important items you will do on that first day include filling out WPO paperwork, turning in your Health and Immunization Form, and getting your Student ID picture taken.

Returning students, faculty, and staff will be buzzing around all day. Please stop anyone in a yellow move-in day shirt, and they will be glad to help you in any way.

9:00am - 11:30am • Check-in and receive your keys! Use all day to settle in and unpack Students begin by checking in at Kittredge Theatre Lobby, where they will finish any necessary forms for financial aid or accounting. Then students and families will be directed to the Residence Hall location for moving in.

9:00am - 3:30pm • Move-in to Your New Room

Students are invited to re-connect with their families.
