Responsible for development and implementation of curriculum for Media Arts and Photography concentration, developing, organizing, and maintaining studios and labs associated with media arts and photography courses, including maintaining two darkrooms. Responsible for budgeting, purchasing, and maintenance of digital and analog media arts equipment.

Intro to Animation: FA22

Introductory course that combines creative exploration of animation techniques with playful experimentation in time-based media. Students expand their unique artistic voices by making short videos using a wide range of animation styles, from stop motion and silhouette, to rotoscope and direct 16mm film animation.

Remix, Reuse, Recycle Media: FA22

Creative found footage course that explores the hidden potential for critique, parody, and commentary using pre-existing media. Students mash up, remix, juxtapose, combine, collage, and re-edit educational media, commercials, news, and fiction films to create a short film and video edits.

Expanded Cinema & Installation: FA22

An advanced course in which students experiment with multi projector film and video performance, video mapping, and time-based media installation. Students work on both digital video and 16mm film to push the bounds of our understanding of how film/video can be experienced, breaking out of (or actually just breaking) the rectangular screen of traditional cinematic exhibition, and entering into the world of the unknown.

Animation II: SP23

An intermediate course in artisanal animation in which students expand upon their skillset to explore movement, pacing, and structure of animations in the media of their choice.

Experimental Documentary: SP23

An intermediate course exploring documentary modes including poetic, observational, performative, and reflexive documentary. Students look at historical and contemporary examples and selected readings, while creating a series of short documentaries in each mode, culminating in a 5 minute experimental documentary or essay film.

Alt Processes: SP23

A studio course in which students explore alternative darkroom processes to create one of a kind moving images and still photographs that play with light. Students explore the material potential of visual media with an expansive view of photography and filmmaking. We experiment with eco-friendly, plant based silver techniques, play with photochemical methods of image creation, build Super 8 and still photography pinhole cameras, and explore cyanotypes and other expansive forms of light-based image development.

Course in core concepts of non-linear editing coupled with concept based projects in found footage video, using Eisenstein's five types of montage. Readings include historical and theoretical readings on editing and found footage. Lessons in the application of fair use.

Capstone class in which students create a single film/video in the style of their choosing over the duration of a semester. Students also create portfolios in preparation for graduation.

Camera/Lighting II: SP22, SP21, SP20, SP21, SP19, SP18, SP17, SP15, SP14, SP13, SP12, SP11, SP10

Project based 16mm film course, sync and non-sync production, flatbed editing. Intermediate image design. Past classes have included intermediate video and short form narrative production.

Camera/Lighting I: FA21, FA20, FA19, FA18, FA17, FA16, FA15, FA14, FA13, FA12, FA11, FA10, FA09

First year course in image design and visual storytelling. Students create a series of short video projects using cinematography and lighting to develop characters and build emotional arcs in their videos.

Project based AfterEffects editing, visual effects, and animation course. Students create animatics, rotoscope animations, animated gifs, spatial montage videos, green screen composites, motion graphics, and other short digital animation projects.

Selected topics class in video production. Currently a course in documentary filmmaking. Previous courses have included non-fiction (video essay, observational documentary, expository documentary), stop-motion animation, and fiction projects.

Expanded Cinema and new media class. Class has also included multi projector film performance, single and multichannel video installation, glitch video, optical toys and alternative projectors, and site specific and immersive installation.

Post Production Sound Design: SP16, SP14

Intermediate sound design course with emphasis on post-production.

An intermediate level course in set design/construction. Students design and create a set and characters for a stop motion animation.

Sound Operations: FA15, SU12, SP10

Introductory course in sound design. Exercises in field & studio recording, foley, and soundscapes. Core concepts in creating meaning with film sound, developing a sound library, mixing, and analyzing film sound.

Intro to Film & Video: FA14, FA11, FA10, SP10, FA09

Introductory film analysis course, included lectures and discussions covering film history to criticism. Students collaborate to create a short production on super8 or HD video, and write formal analysis papers.

Videography I: SU13, SU12, SU11

Hands-on, project based art course in experimental video and audio. Projects include abstract video, experimental soundscapes, optical toys, and video installation.

Videography II: SU12

Intermediate art class in experimental video, exploring optical experiments. Students create cameraless films, lensless (pinhole) videos, and stereoscopic projects.

Grip/Electrical I: SP12, SU11, SU10

Topics course in grip and electrical. Students work on crews for larger student productions, as well as do in-class exercises. In the past, this has also been taught as a topics course in music video as well as color theory.

Production Management: SP11

Hands-on, project based course in production management and grant writing.

Success & Study Skills: SU10, FA09

Activity based first-year course in college skills, including reading comprehension, study techniques, note taking, and using library resources.

Art Department Operations I: FA09

Hands-on introduction to set design, concept art, and storyboarding. Emphasis on production planning and design, the history of production design, and set construction. Students design and build a studio corner set and scale models.

Darkroom Cinematography: SP22

Students learn both traditional black and white negative processing, as well as experiment with alternative, eco-friendly plant-based processing techniques, and cameraless darkroom practices.
